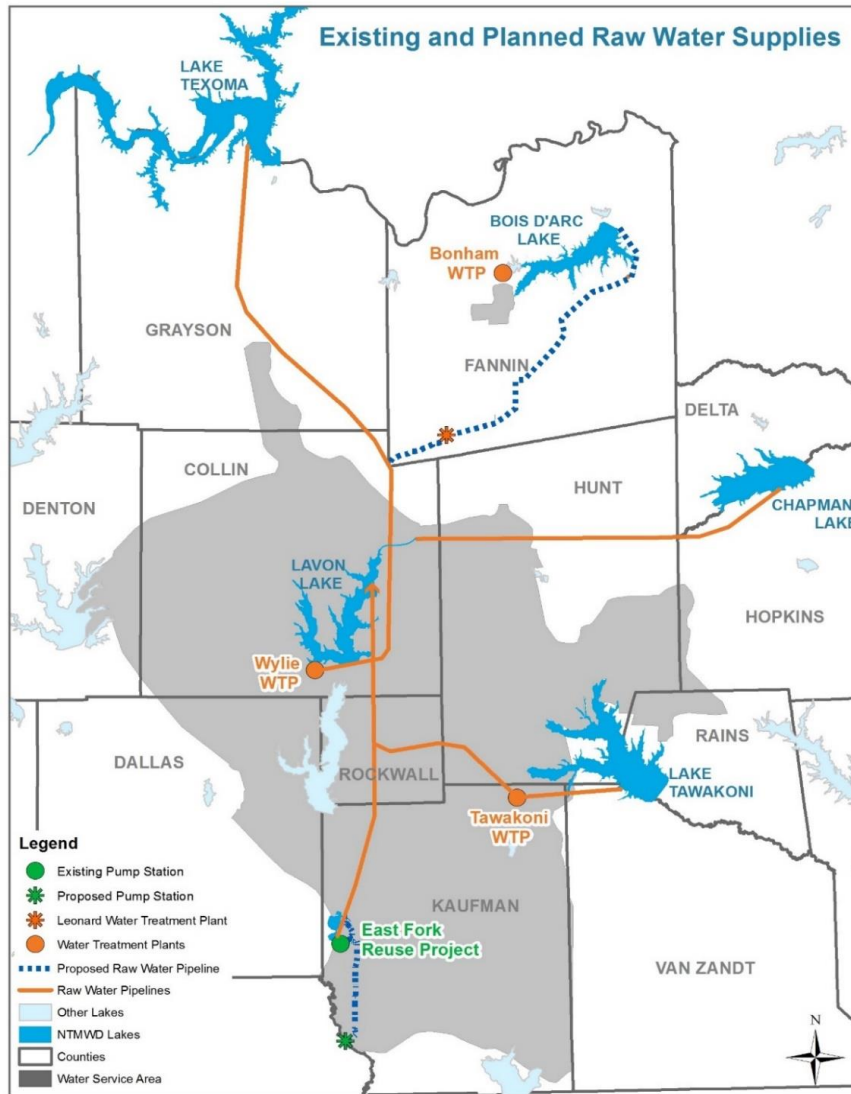

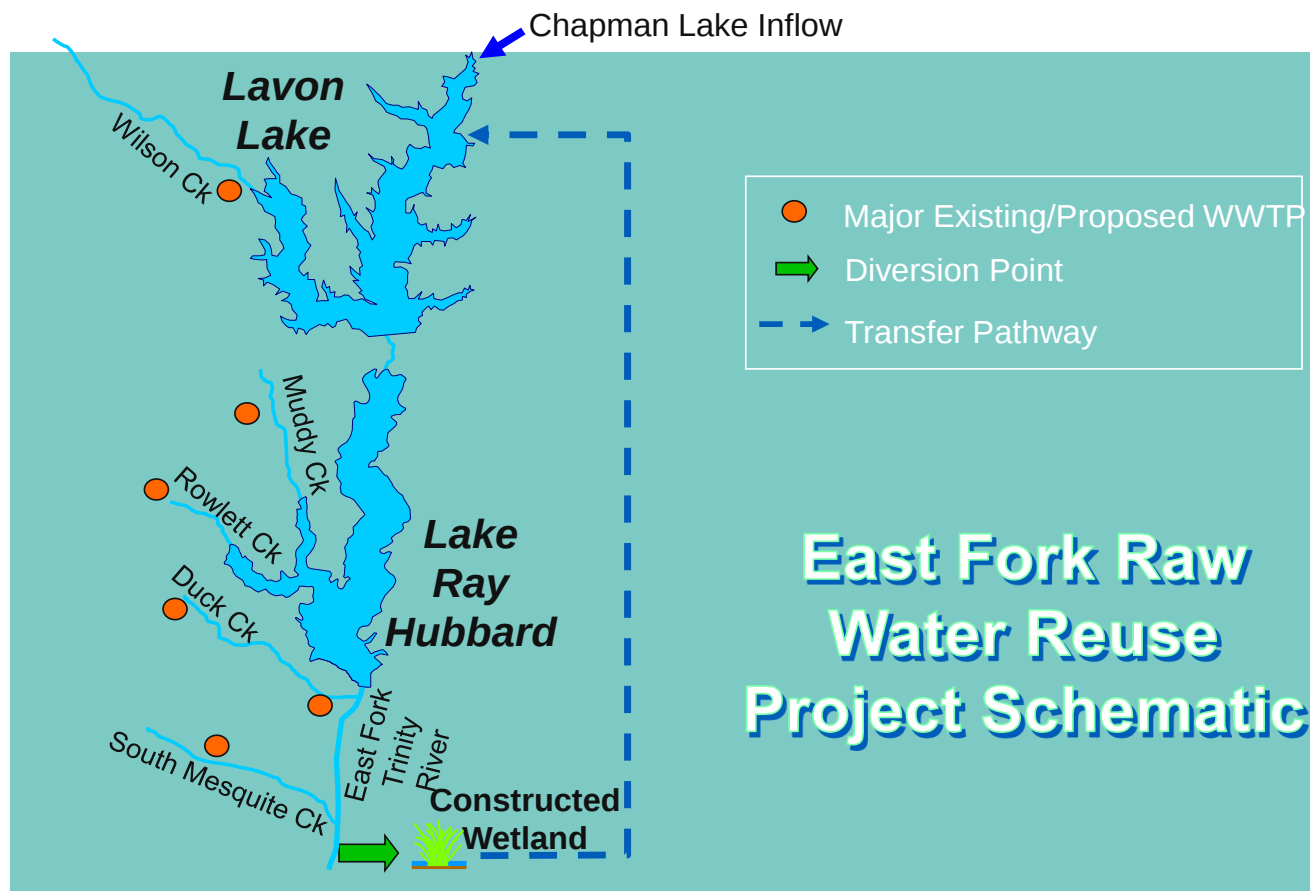

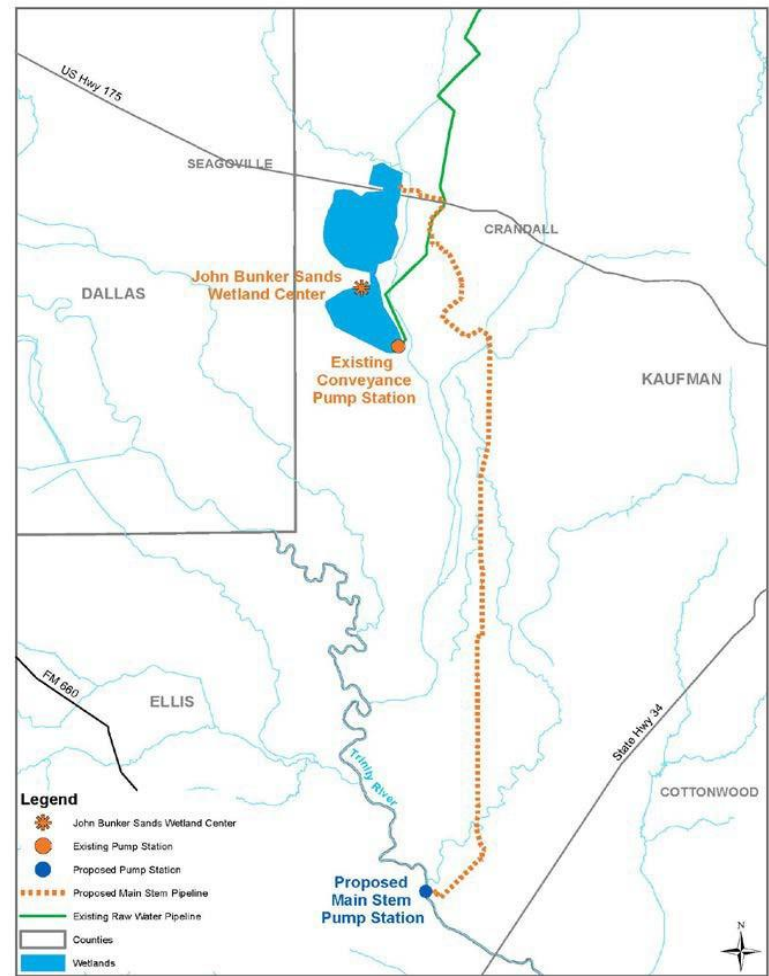




FUTURE SUPPLIES: PROJECTS

Trinity River Main Stem Pump Station & Pipeline

- Expands reuse supplies by diverting flows from river into wetlands
- Up to 100 million gallons per day (MGD)
- 17 miles, 72-inch-diameter pipeline
- Cost approx. \$120 million
- Testing this fall – complete end of 2019

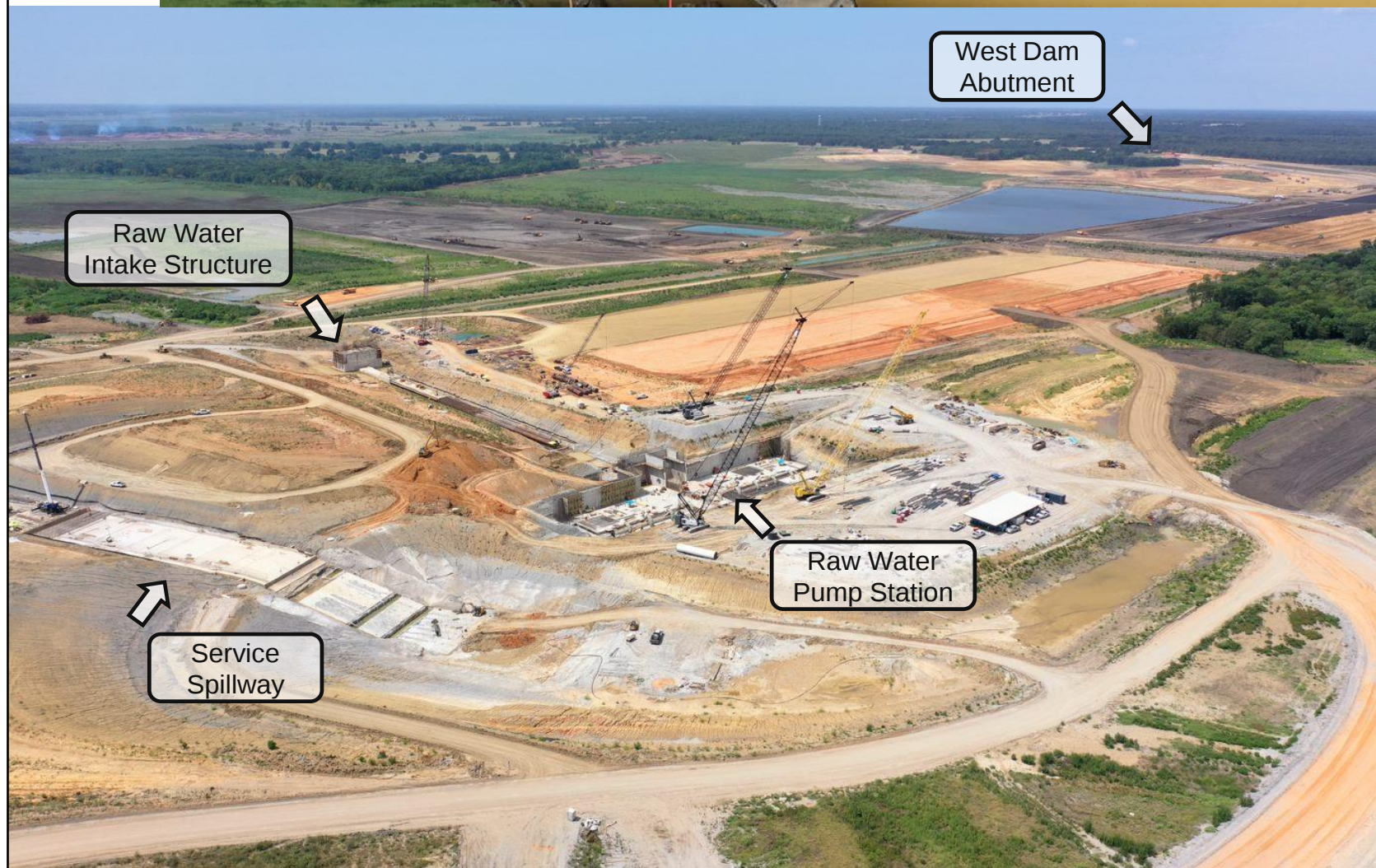

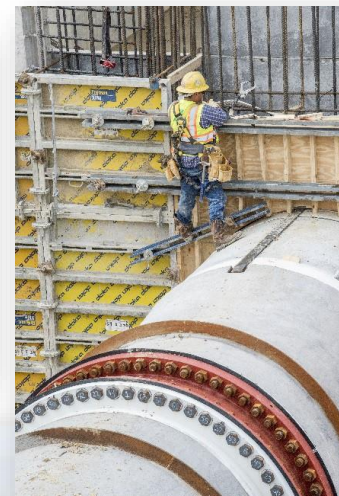






AGING INFRASTRUCTURE NEEDS REPAIRS, UPGRADES

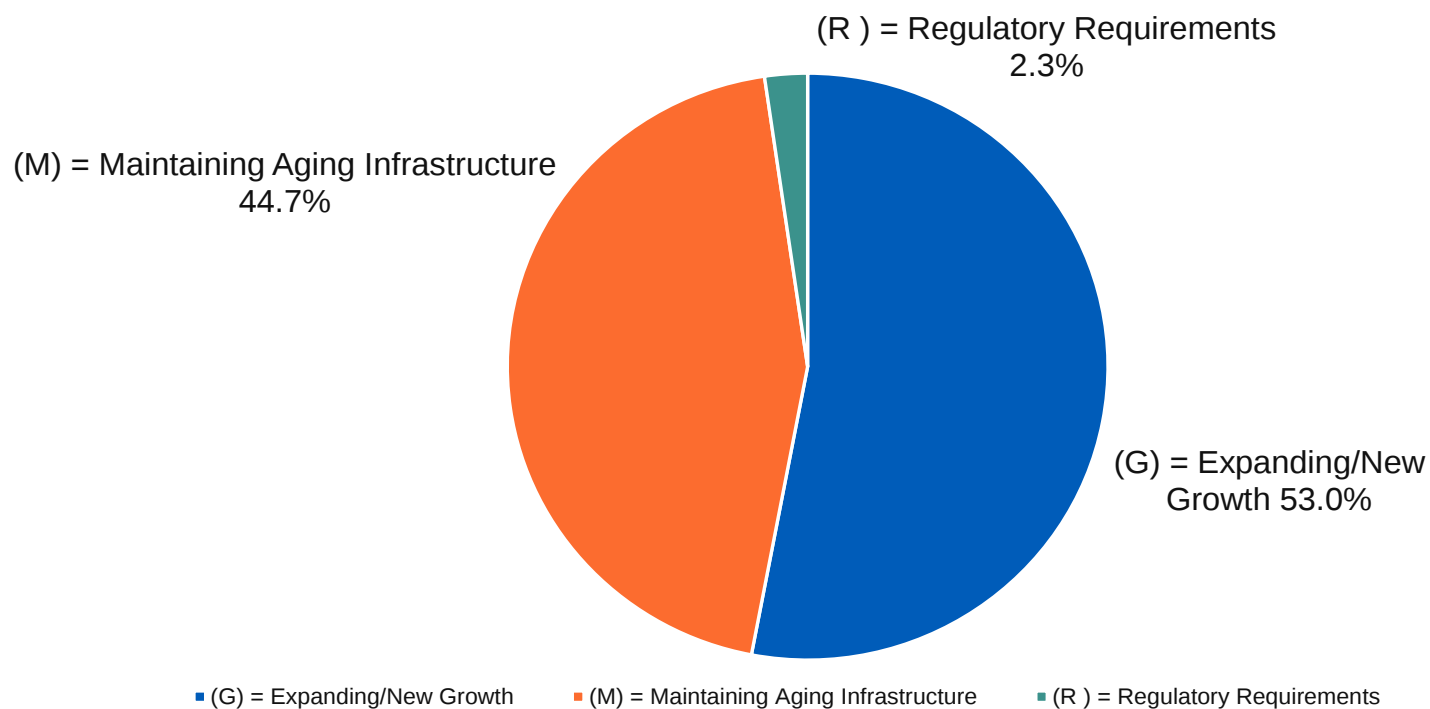

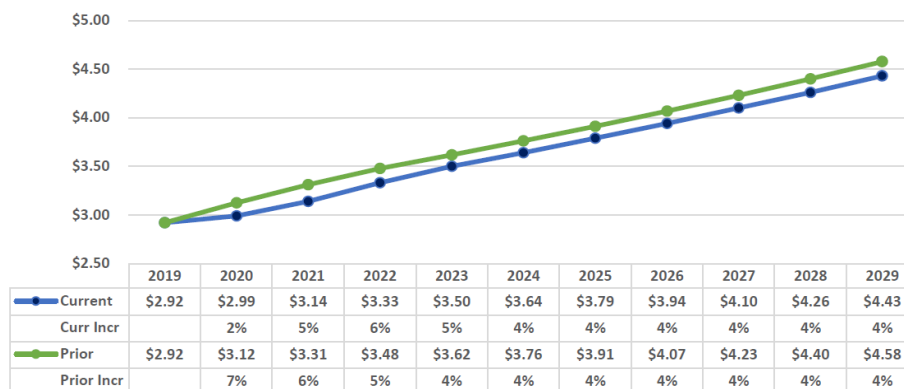

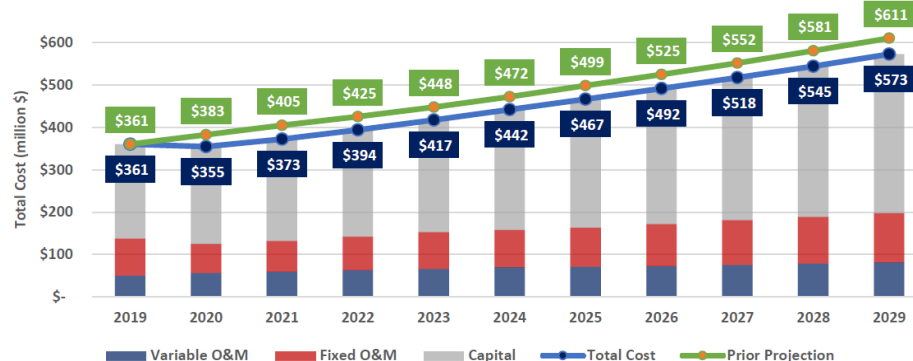
2019 Variable Costs

Member Cost Per 1,000 Gallons



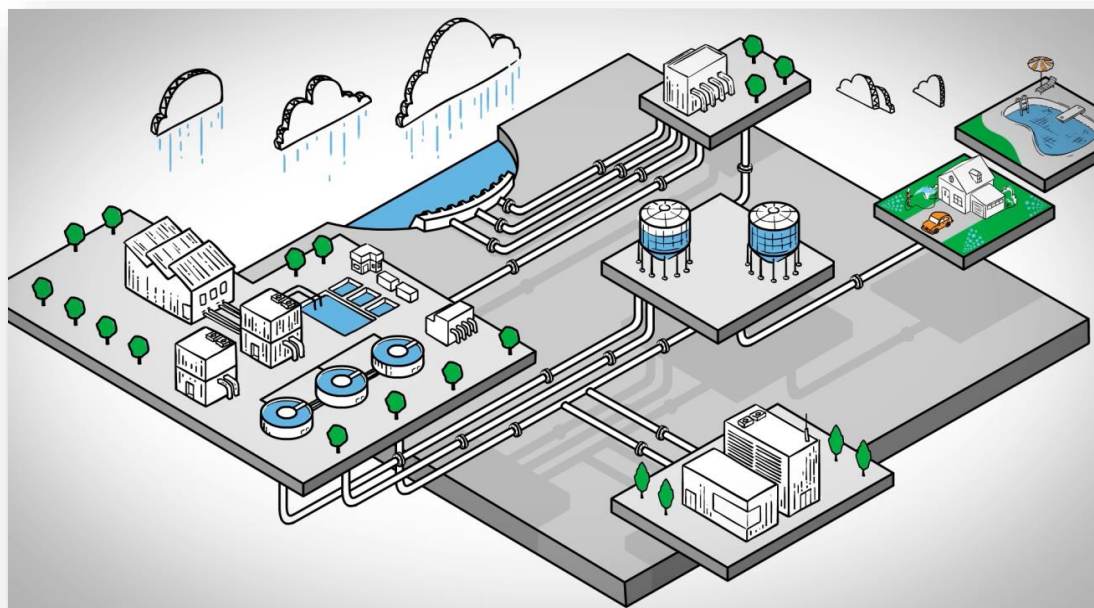

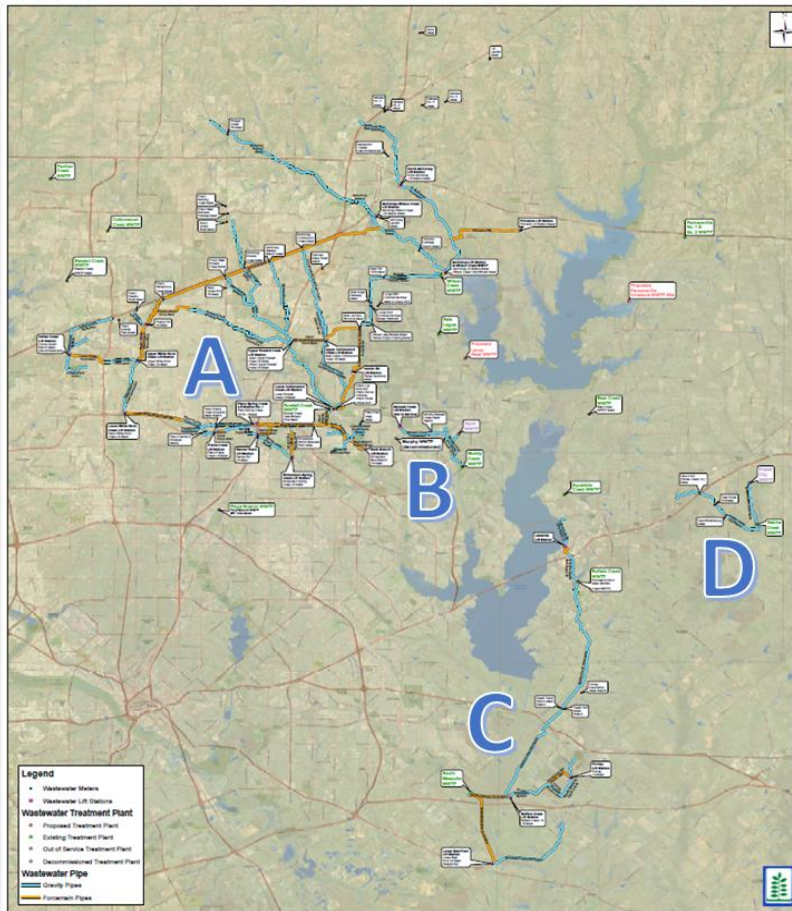

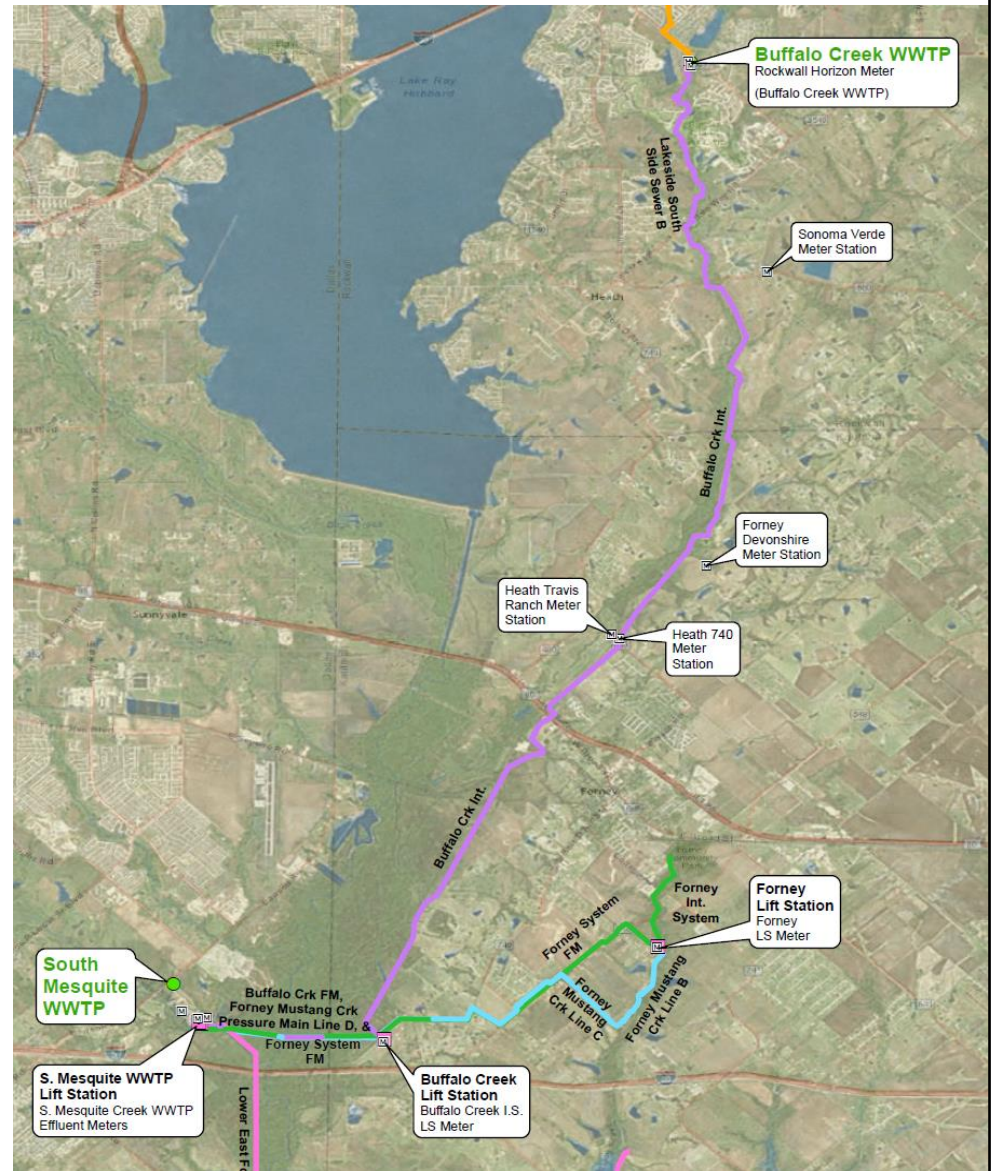


NTMWD BUFFALO CREEK INTERCEPTOR SYSTEM

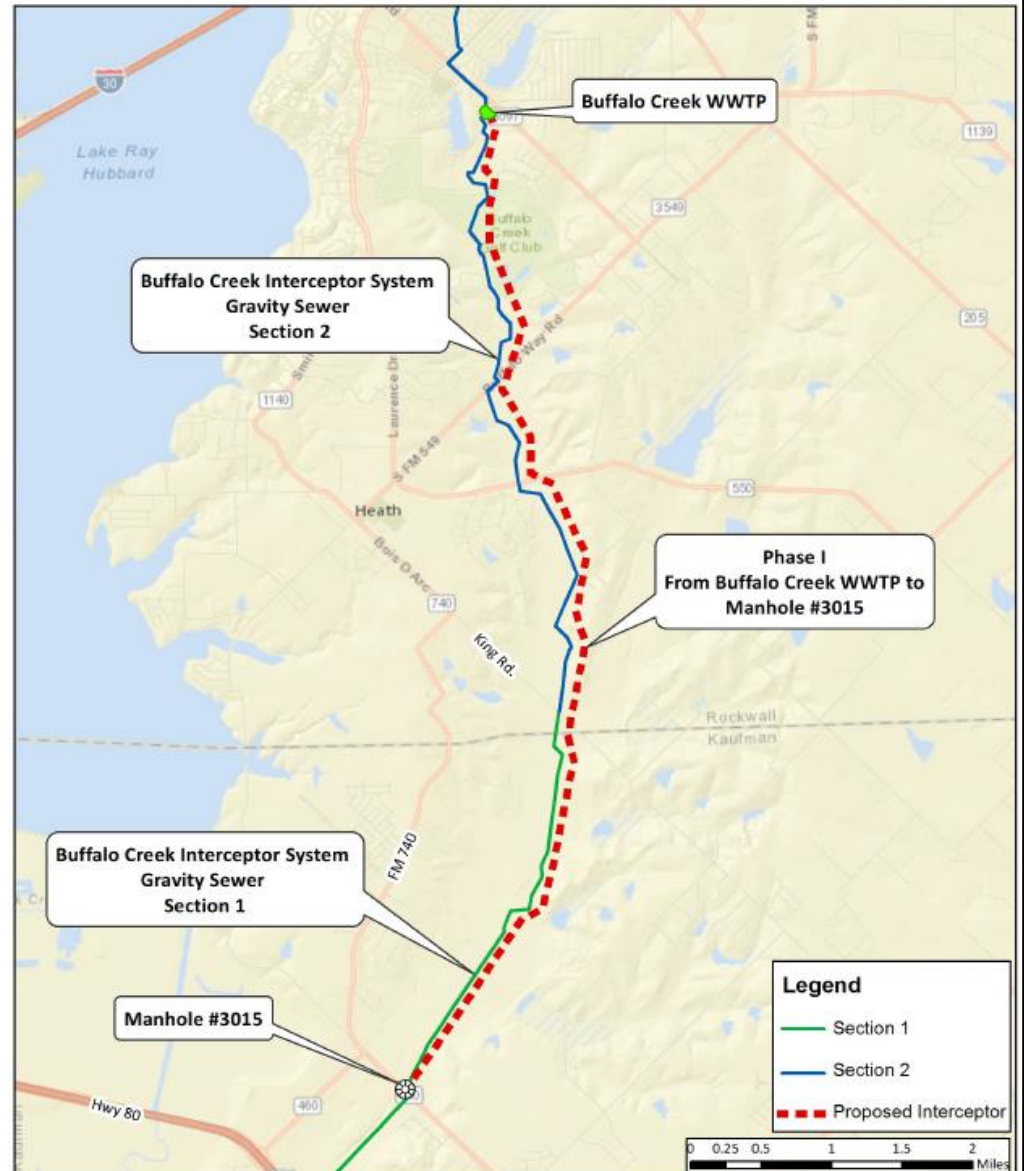
BUFFALO CREEK INTERCEPTOR SYSTEM

- Est. construction cost = \$25M

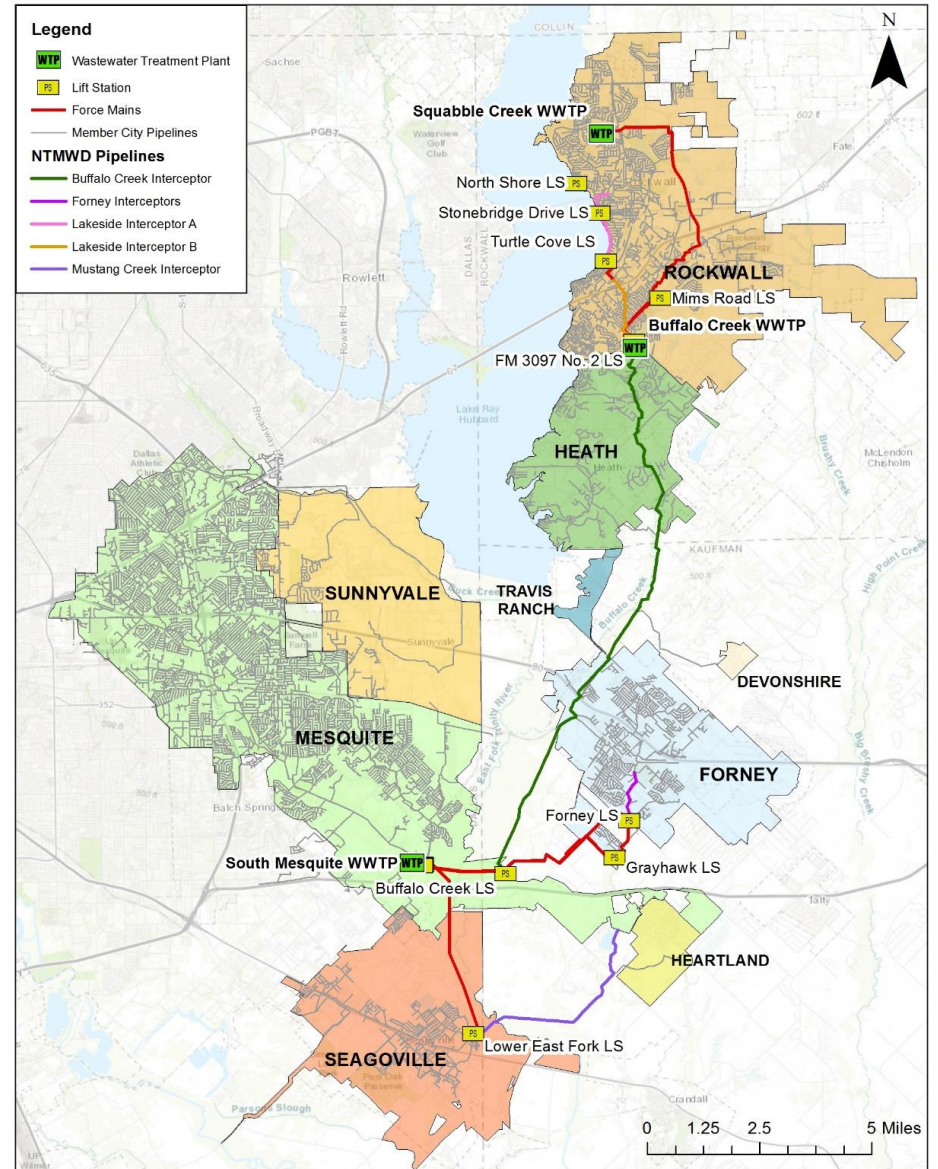

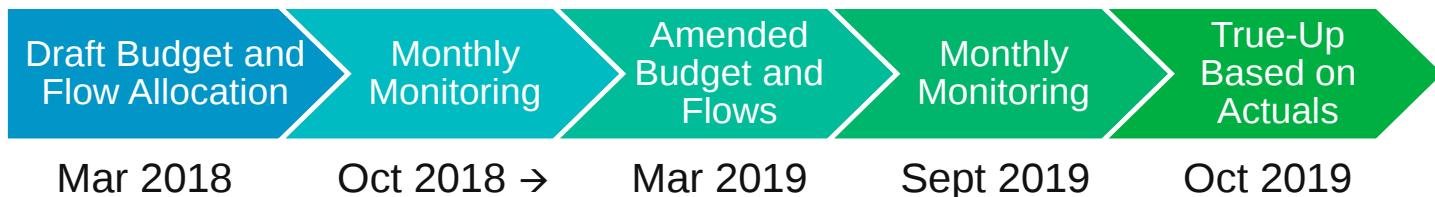
COST ALLOCATION OF REGIONAL WASTEWATER SYSTEM

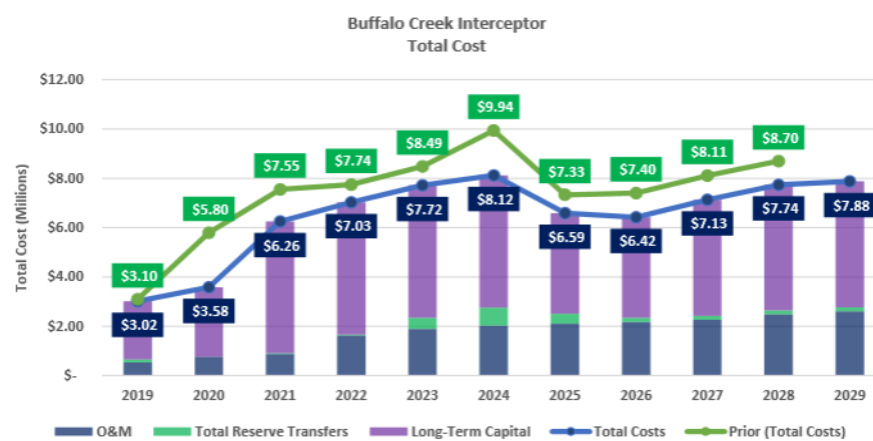
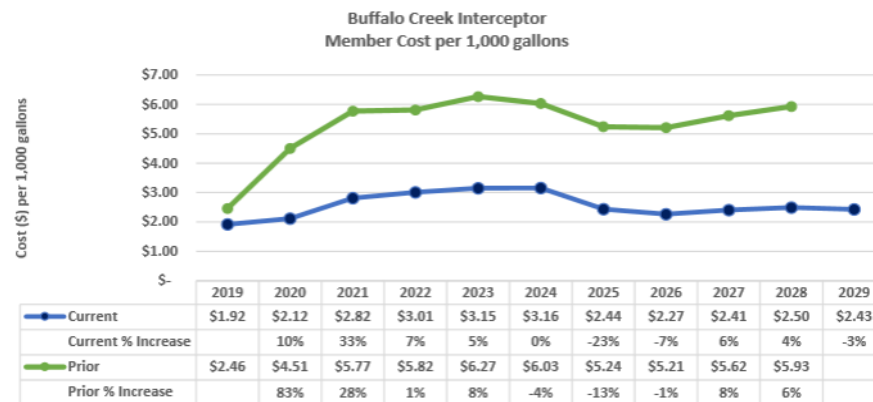

REGIONAL WASTEWATER SYSTEM COST OF SERVICE

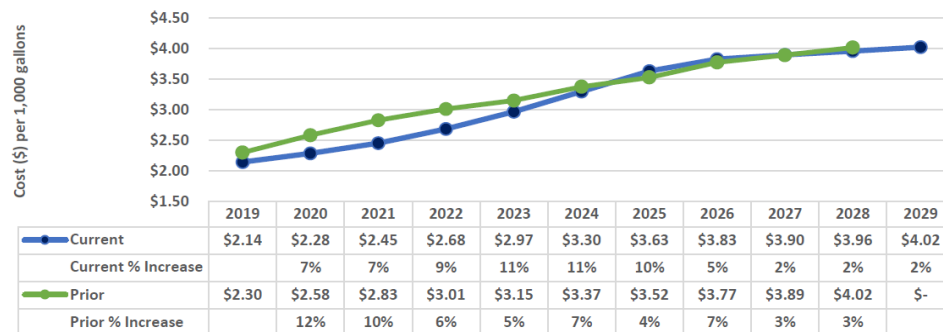

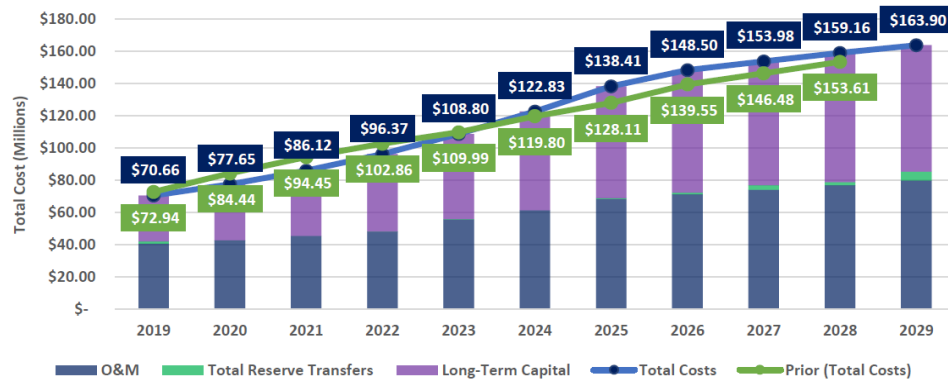

The City Council of the City of McLendon-Chisholm convened in Regular Session on Tuesday, October 8, 2019, at City Hall, 1371 West FM 550, McLendon-Chisholm, Texas, with the following members present:

Mayor Short called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

2. INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO U.S. AND TEXAS FLAGS

Council Member Hodges delivered the Invocation and Mayor Short led the Pledge of Allegiance to the U.S. and Texas Flags.

- 6.1. Public hearing, discussion and action regarding a request by Anthony Crowley on behalf of Ty Davenport, seeking approval of a Final Plat for Davenport Estates, 6.188 acres, part of Rockwall CAD Parcel ID No. 11452, K Latham Survey,**

Mayor Short opened the public hearing at 6:35 p.m.

City Planner Crowley provided the Council with the following report regarding this request.

REQUEST:

Approval of a final plat of a 6.88-acre property to construct a single-family residence on the portion of the property zoned A District with frontage on Smith Road.

PROPERTY OWNER: Ty Davenport
1730 S. Hwy 205
McLendon-Chisholm, TX 75032

REPRESENTATIVE: Anthony Crowley

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: APPROVAL, the plat meets all the technical requirements and complies with zoning and subdivision regulations.

CONDITIONS:

Prior to the issuance of any authorization for construction of infrastructure, drainage, or structures, the final civil engineering plans be reviewed and approved by the City's Engineer.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The proposed final plat consists of one proposed lot of record in the A District. The applicant has conveyed the purpose of the plat is to create one legal building site for a single-family residence. In the A District, Single Family is an allowed use. The width of the parcel existed before the adoption of the Zoning Ordinance in 2007, and as such, is legal non-conforming. The proposed plat complies with the following zoning regulations of the A District:

DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS	A DISTRICT (minimum)	PROPOSAL
Lot area	2.5 acres	5.981 acres*
Lot width	300 feet	299.6 feet **
Lot depth	200 feet	898.7 feet

*Excludes 0.206-acre portion of property to be dedicated to the City for Smith Road.

** Legal non-conforming.

Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval and the City Council approved the Preliminary Plat.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: APPROVAL.

The final plat meets all technical requirements and complies with all zoning and subdivision regulations. Staff recommends approval subject to the conditions listed below.

NOTE: This item was supposed to be held on September 19, 2019; however, there was no Quorum at the hearing in the mentioned meeting. Therefore, it was scheduled for October 3, 2019.

CONDITIONS:

1. Access: The proposed plat would leave a 3.85-acre remainder not part of the proposed plat. In order to ensure future access to this remainder, the applicant has agreed to dedicate a 20-foot wide access easement, by separate instrument, from the remainder parcel to FM 550. Said easement must be recorded by separate instrument at Rockwall County, and the recordation information must be cited on the final plat. It is the city's understanding that the remainder parcel will be incorporated into adjacent parcels and will have permanent access to public right-of-way in the future. **This condition has been met per the attached recorded Access Easement. ***
2. Engineering/Utility Connection: Prior to the issuance of any authorization for construction of infrastructure, drainage, or structures, the final civil engineering plans be reviewed and approved by the City's Engineer. *
3. Thoroughfare/Streets: The applicant is dedicating 30 feet of property to the centerline to align with a proposed right-of-way of 60 feet for Smith Road. The right-of-way dedication will leave 5.981 acres for private development. **This condition has been met. ***

4. Surveyor determine elevation for drainage easement based on top of dam elevation and place easement on plat prior to it being filed. **This has been completed and must be reviewed by the City Engineer. ***

***All conditions for this plat must be met before filing for record.**

The Planning & Zoning Commission recommended approval of the Final Plat contingent on all conditions being met.

Mayor Short closed the public hearing.

6.2. Presentation by Dan Jackson representing Wildan Financial and discussion regarding 2019 Wastewater Rate Study and Financial Forecast.

City Administrator Palomba explained that the City entered into an agreement with Dan Jackson, representing Wildan Financial, to provide a Wastewater Rate Analysis for the purpose of determining appropriate rates. Mr. Jackson has completed his analysis and is present to present his findings to Council. Council will be provided an opportunity to ask questions and discuss his analysis.

City Administrator Palomba added that a representative from North Texas Municipal Water district is scheduled to attend the October 22, 2019 City Council meeting to present information regarding scheduled wastewater infrastructure improvements and provide an opportunity for Council to ask questions.

Staff recommends that Council receive the presentation this evening and schedule action related to wastewater fees for November 12, 2019. At that time, Council should have adequate information to make a well-informed decision regarding wastewater rates.

Mr. Jackson presented the 2019 Wastewater Rate Study and Financial Forecast for the City of McLendon-Chisholm. His presentation included the following points:

6.3. Discussion and action regarding consideration of Letter of Engagement with Murrey Paschall & Caperton, P.C. for auditing City of McLendon-Chisholm financial statements for Fiscal Year 2018-2019 for a price not to exceed \$11,000.

City Administrator Paloma explained that securing auditing services is standard following the end of the fiscal year. The City needs to get on the auditor's schedule. The audit is expected to begin in December and reports presented no later than the end of March 2020.

The City budgeted \$15,000 for auditing services. The proposal calls for \$11,000.

The purpose of the audit is to examine the City's financial statements to obtain reasonable assurance the financial statements are free from: 1) errors; 2) fraudulent financial reporting; and, 3) misappropriation of assets or violation of laws.

Kyle Caperton has been doing the audits since 2012. There are no requirements to rotate audit firms although it is considered a best practice to do so every few years.

which the City of McLendon-Chisholm Fire and Rescue has permanent responsibility for first alarm response to fires in such district.

- d) "Employed" means a firefighter who is a volunteer firefighter.
- e) "Fire Chief" means the Fire Chief or volunteer firefighter of McLendon-Chisholm Fire and Rescue or his duly authorized designees.
- f) "Firefighter" means a firefighter of the City or a firefighter with McLendon-Chisholm Fire and Rescue.
- g) "Requesting Party" means the entity requesting fire protection assistance from the City for fire services for residents of the County, but not living within any city's incorporated limit.

Section 3. The parties hereto hereby agree that the City will provide fire equipment and services to points in the County which are outside the corporate limits of any city in the County, but inside the boundary limits known as First Alarm County District for the City. Areas outside such boundary shall be known as the Second Alarm County District for the City, and a closer fire department shall be notified for first response.

Section 4. In consideration of such service, the County will pay to the City the sum of Seventy-Seven Thousand Five Hundred (\$77,500.00) dollars for calls outside the corporate limits of any city in the County subject to annual funding approval by the Rockwall County Commissioner's Court during the regular budget process. Said payment shall be made on an annual basis upon written request from the City to the Rockwall County Auditor and will be payable within thirty (30) days after receipt of such, by the Auditor's Office.

Section 5. County hereby gives and grants to the City full and complete authority to operate its fire fighting vehicles on and over public roads, highways, and other thoroughfares of the County and other public places.

Section 6. City shall, at its own cost and expense, purchase and keep in force at all times insurance for the minimum amount of liability under the Texas Tort Claims Act. City agrees to provide copies of such policy or policies of insurance and/or other evidence satisfactory to the County Auditor of Rockwall County, Texas.

Section 7. The Fire Chief shall be the sole judge of the amount and type of equipment and number of personnel dispatched to calls made pursuant to this Agreement. Said Fire Chief, or his designee, shall be in charge of the firefighting techniques used in response to any calls.

For each call made pursuant to this Agreement, the Fire Chief shall prepare a report showing the date, location, and description of the call. True copies of such reports shall be on file with the Fire Chief and available for review by the County Auditor or Commissioners Court of the County.

Section 8. City hereby agrees to render services to other Fire Districts within the County if backup emergency assistance is requested. The City's fire fighters shall report to the Requesting Party's Officer In Control at the location to which they have been assigned, and shall be under the command of the Requesting Party's Fire Chief and will be released when their services are no longer required.

Calls for assistance may be aborted only by (1) another Fire Department at the scene; (2) an officer of the Sheriff's Department at the scene; (3) a State Department of Public Safety Officer at the scene; (4) the responding department's Fire Chief or designee; (5) or Dispatch.

Section 9. While any fire fighter, regularly employed as such by the City, is in the service of the Requesting Party, such fire fighter shall be a fire fighter of the Requesting Party and be under the command of the Requesting Party's Chief, with all the powers of a regular fire fighter of the Requesting Party, as fully as if such fire fighter were within the territorial limits of the governmental entity where such fire fighter is regularly employed. A fire fighter's qualifications for employment by the governmental entity by which he or she is regularly employed shall constitute such fire fighter's qualifications for such position within the territorial limits of the Requesting Party, and no other oath, bond or compensation need be made.

Section 10. Each party to this Agreement expressly waives the right to recovery from the other party for reimbursement of wages, disability, pension payments, damages to equipment and clothing, medical expenses, travel, food and lodging expenses.

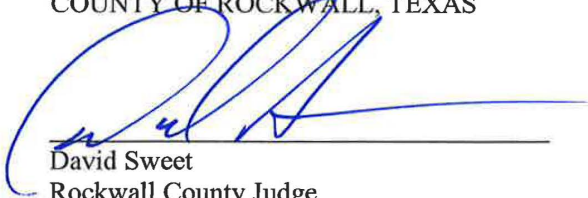
Section 11. Any fire fighter or other person who is assigned, designated or ordered by the Fire Chief of the party which regularly employs such, to perform duties pursuant to this Agreement, shall receive the same wages, salary, pension, compensation and all other rights for such service, including injury benefits, death benefits, and worker's compensation benefits, as if the service had been rendered within the territorial limits of the party where such fire fighter is regularly employed. Moreover, all wage and disability payments, including worker's compensation benefits, pension payments, damage to equipment and clothing, medical expenses, and expenses of travel, food and lodging, shall be paid by the party which regularly employs such person in the same manner as if the service had been rendered within the territorial limits of the party where such fire fighter is regularly employed.

Section 12. In the event that any person performing firefighting services pursuant to this Agreement shall be cited as a party to any civil lawsuit, state or federal, arising out of the performance of those services, such fire fighter shall be entitled to the same benefits that he or she would be entitled to receive if such civil action had arisen out of the performance of such person's duties as a member of the department where and in the jurisdiction of the party where such person is regularly employed.

Section 13. Each party to this Agreement expressly waives all claims against the other party for compensation arising from loss, damage, personal injury or death occurring as a consequence of the performance of this Agreement.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have caused this Agreement to be executed under authority of appropriate action taken by their respective governing bodies.
